WEBINAR PURPOSE: A proliferation of benchmarks and indices is tracking the impact of global food production on the planet’s and people’s well-being. These are assessing the progress being made by countries and the agri-food sector, alike, on a host of factors, including the environment and climate change, nutrition and health, food safety, animal care, and labour well-being and rights. A Canadian project is considering the global context in which the country operates and competes and why developing a national index is merited – a credible set of metrics to show that Canada is among the most environmentally sustainable, safest and responsible global food leaders. This webinar is about exploring how taking such an approach to benchmark the country’s performance can also become an important lens to consider policy and regulatory issues and inform strategy.

KEY QUESTION: How can better benchmarking a country’s agri-food performance (on environmental, social and health outcomes) inform policy-making and strategy in an ever-changing global food system?
