Lauren Baker, Director of Programs, Global Alliance for the Future of Food



Lauren Baker, PhD, has more than 20 years of experience leading cross-sectoral research, policy and advocacy for sustainable food systems in non-profit, academic, business, policy and philanthropic contexts. Lauren is currently Director of Programs with the Global Alliance for the Future of Food, an alliance of philanthropic foundations working to transform global food systems. At the Global Alliance, Lauren's work is focused on the intersections between food systems and health, climate change, agroecology and true cost accounting. Previously, Lauren led the Toronto Food Policy Council, a citizen advisory group embedded within the City of Toronto's Public Health Division. She was the Founding Director of Sustain Ontario — the Alliance for Healthy Food and Farming. Lauren lectures and teaches in the Global Food Equity program at the University of Toronto and at Ryerson University.

David Bennell, North American Lead, Food and Nature, World Business Council for Sustainable Development



David Bennell is the North American lead for the Food and Nature for the World Business Council for Sustainable Development where he focuses on scaling positive agriculture, natural climate solutions, and global food systems reform.

Previously, he was Director of Food and Capital Markets for the investor network Ceres. He's worked for Microsoft, REI and LL Bean in leadership development, product development and sourcing positions. His career also includes working as a funder focused on sustainable forestry, the co-creation of the for-profit social enterprise company CottonConnect, co-creation of an impact investing fund focused on food and agriculture investments and leading the apparel industry NGO Textile Exchange focused on standards development for responsible sourcing. David created the world's most-watched sustainability series on Linked In Learning called *Sustainability Strategies*, as well as previously held a five-year adjunct faculty position at MIT where he taught sustainable design and development.

Keith Currie, Vice-President, Canadian Federation of Agriculture & President, Ontario Federation of Agriculture



Keith Currie, a Collingwood Ontario-area farmer, was re-elected as President of the Ontario Federation of Agriculture (OFA) at the 2019 Annual General Meeting for his fourth one-year term leading OFA's 38,000 farm family members. He is the organization's 31st President. Currie has more than 25 years of experience with OFA and agricultural advocacy, which began with an appointment to the Simcoe County Federation of Agriculture, where he held numerous positions including President from 2004-2006. He has served on and chaired many local and provincial agriculture organizations as well as many conservation initiatives during his career.

Currie's career in advocacy has led to numerous appointments to provincial government advisory panels such as 2019, Ontario Advisory Panel on Climate Change, 2015, 4-Plan Review Panel: a review of significant land use plans in Ontario, and to the Ministry of Agriculture, Food and Rural Affairs (OMAFRA) Minister's Advisory Panel.

In February of 2019, Currie was elected as the First Vice President of the Canadian Federation of Agriculture (CFA) at the CFA annual meeting in Ottawa.

With a diploma in Agriculture Production Management from Ridgeway College, Currie returned home to the Collingwood Ontario family operation, to manage an eighth-generation dairy and cash crop farm in Simcoe County with his wife Janice and four children. The dairy herd was dispersed in 2003 and the operation now focuses on production of grains and oilseed, forages for dry hay, along with a sweet corn and gladiolus flower production.

Erin Fitzgerald serves as CEO of the U.S. Farmers & Ranchers in Action® (USFRA®), a non-profit that believes farmers and ranchers uniquely contribute to prosperous communities, nourishing people and a resilient and restorative planet. USFRA is dedicated to unprecedented leadership and action by convening farmers and ranchers with food and agricultural leaders to create and lead a common vision to further our sustainable food systems. Fitzgerald's thought leadership in the sustainability space convenes food and agriculture stakeholders in an inclusive dialogue on the sustainable food systems of the 21st century. Prior to USFRA, Erin Fitzgerald served as Senior Vice President, Global Sustainability for the Innovation Center for U.S. Dairy, where she conducted an environmental impact assessment that led to an industry-wide voluntary carbon reduction goal of 25 percent by 2020. Erin has been recognized in Chicago's 40 under 40 and is an avid voice for sustainability and social responsibility (White House Champion of Change for Sustainable and Climate-Smart Agriculture, Aspen Institute First Movers Fellow).

Luis Carazo Jimenez, Head of Unit, DG Agriculture and Rural Development, European Commission



Luis is an Agriculture Engineer (Polytechnic University of Madrid) who joined the European Commission public service at the late 1990s. He has spent most of his professional career on the management of agriculture markets (i.e., olive oil, grains, sugar, animal products). In 2019, he was appointed Head of the Unit in the Directorate General for Agriculture and Rural Development in charge of international relations with the American continent.

Margarita Lysenkova, Manager, Standards, GRI (Global Reporting Initiative)



Margarita Lysenkova joined GRI Standards Division in the beginning of 2019 to work on the GRI Sector Program. Margarita leads projects and expert groups, representing business enterprises, investment institutions, labor unions, civil society organizations, and mediating institutions (consultants, academia, or multilateral organizations, including UN agencies). The first pilot project Margarita worked on was Sector Standard: Oil and Gas. Currently, Margarita is leading the second pilot project – GRI Sector Standards Agriculture and Fishing.

Margarita has an international work experience across four countries, spanning socioeconomic research and human rights. From 2013 to 2016 Margarita worked in the International Labour Standards department of the International Labour Organization in Geneva. Previously, David was President & CEO of the Canadian Agri-Food Policy Institute and has worked for a global life sciences company, a chartered bank, a financial services association and a Royal Commission. He is the former Chair of WaterAid Canada and Trustee of London-based WaterAid International, an NGO dedicated to improving water, sanitation and hygiene across the global south. He is a graduate of the London School of Economics and Dalhousie University.
